LETTER FROM THE OWNERS



years now and we ride pretty regularly, have our own special Father's Day ride, plus ride to camp, and attend Easyriders Rodeo at Fowlerville together.









FLAT TRACK RACER CHARLES "CHUCK" GROVER

Charles Edward Grover November 13th, 1915 - March 26th, 1993




Chuck Grover was born in Marlette, Michigan, the son of Floyd and Gertrude Grover. Chuck had four sisters and he was raised in Michigan. On June 27th, 1936, Chuck married his sweetheart Viola Bouley. On April 26th, 1938, Chuck and Viola would welcome daughter Charlotte (his only child)



into the world. His passion for the sport even found its way to his grandson, Chuck Kelly who also was a skilled rider. Chuck started racing for Dick Beane in 1938 and became a professional racer within a couple of years. He worked a factory job at Mueller Brass for many

years and in the later part of his working career he worked as a construction worker. Although he always worked a regular job, he also worked on motorcycles on the side, and of course he also raced professionally. At some point in his career, he also had some small dealerships with Harley Davidson, then later a Norton and Ducati dealership, and later a partnership in a Honda Dealer for a short time.



When daughter Charlotte grew up, she married Neil Kelly of Port Huron. Neil fit in with the Grovers well as he was also a motorcycle enthusiast. Charlotte was quite a skilled motorcycle rider herself, just like her Mom. Neil and the Grovers were all members of the Sunset Riders Motorcycle Club in St. Clair County Michigan. Chuck and Neil raced together on a Harley Davidson non-studded sidecar bike and seldom ever lost a race for many years. The family all rode motorcycles together on the road for different events and Chuck and Neil both competed in several different types of motorcycle racing. At different times, both Chuck and Neil had performed daredevil feats such as riding a motorcycle through a flaming wooden wall or as it was called "smashing through the flaming wall of death."

Although Chuck never won a National Race, he had some podium finishes including a 2nd place at Shreveport and a 3rd, a 4th, a 5th, and a 6th place finish at the famous Springfield Mile Championship. He also won some very big Non-National Races like Dayton several times and the Michigan State Championship and established himself as one of the top Dirttrack Racers in the world.




Chuck was a factory Harley Davidson team racer from 1941 to 1953. Like many top racers of his time, Chuck missed out on racing Nationals during some of his prime years because of racing being shut down during World War II. He was considered to be an expert mechanic and did all of the mechanical work on his own bike and occasionally for other racers as well. After his professional flat tracking career was over, he was a champion non-studded ice racer



for many years and was considered by some to be the greatest nonstudded ice racer of all

Chuck was also an Honorary Lifetime Member of the Port Huron Motorcycle Club. He was heartbroken





when he lost his wife in a motorcycle accident in 1975. Retiring from the workforce in 1977, Chuck made his own homemade trike motorcycle and enjoyed riding it around and would even take it to Florida every year. He remarried eventually to second wife Sarah, and he continued to enjoy being a motorcycle enthusiast and is said to have even rode his motorcycle with his dog Corky.



THE MOTORCYCLE LAWYER ON THE LAW

You Better Have this Special Insurance on Your Car if You Are Ever in a Motorcycle Wreck

s you may have guessed by now, May is Motorcycle Awareness Month. What you may not know is how essential it is to have this special insurance on your car in case of a motorcycle wreck.

If you are in a motorcycle accident with a car, truck, or van, insured motorcyclists get no-fault benefits (payment for medical bills, wage loss, medical mileage, and house chores). If you are the owner and operator of an uninsured motorcycle, you do not get these no-fault benefits. This could mean hundreds of thousands of dollars in medical bills you are stuck with.

If you are operating or riding on a **MOTORCYCLE** and you are involved in an accident with a motor vehicle (a car, truck, van, but not another motorcycle), the automobile insurance company that is responsible for paying your no-fault benefits is determined by what we call the Order of Priorities. We just follow down a list of people involved in the crash who potentially have insurance until we identify actual insurance coverage on a person in the highest order of priority.

I can explain it better with an example: I'm in a motorcycle accident with a car. We first establish that I did have insurance on my motorcycle, so I'm eliqible for no-fault benefits. Next, we inquire whether the owner, and then next, the operator of the car involved in the crash has insurance. If so, that insurance company must pay my benefits.

If there is no insurance for the owner or operator of the car, we then go to the next person with insurance in the Order of Priorities. In this example, it would be the car or truck insurance company of the operator of the motorcycle. In other words, we go to my (motorcyclist's) car insurance. Yes, the car that was in my garage and had nothing to do with my motorcycle accident can be the insurance company responsible for paying.

I advise that you choose "unlimited PIP Medical" (or as much as you possibly can afford) on YOUR CARS, TRUCKS, and VANS (your "motor vehicles"). Why? Because if you get in a motorcycle wreck and the at-fault driver is uninsured, your no-fault benefits will come from insurance on YOUR motor vehicle (car, truck, or van, not motorcycle) and it's best for you to have UNLIMITED PIP Medial which pays all your medical bills for life.

FYI: You can't buy No-Fault insurance on a motorcycle. No-fault benefits never come from your motorcycle insurance. We now choose the amount of PIP Medical coverage for our "motor vehicles" (cars, trucks, vans, not motorcycles).

Michigan No-Fault Medical coverage used to pay for all auto-injury related medical bills **for life**. It was the best coverage in the country. As this is no longer the case, we now must choose our desired amount of PIP Medical coverage on our cars, trucks and vans.

The choices are:

- Unlimited, \$500,000, or \$250,000.
- People with qualified Medicaid recipients can choose \$50,000 coverage.

Again, we recommend motorcyclists choose unlimited PIP medical coverage on their cars, trucks, and vans because it is basically the insurance policy second in line of priority to pay the nofault benefits after a motorcycle accident. Given the many uninsured drivers on our roads, there is a decent chance that if you are in a motorcycle accident with a motor vehicle it will be uninsured, and you'll end up getting no-fault benefits from your own car's insurance

The Difference between Memorial Day and Veteran's Day "Let's put the memorial back in Memorial Day."

emorial Day is not the same as Veteran's Day. While Veterans Day honors all who have served honorably in our military. **Memorial Day** focuses particularly on those who have died in the line of duty. This distinction is quite important to military-connected children and their families.

"Three years after the Civil War ended, on May 5, 1868, the head of an organization of Union veterans -- the Grand Army of the Republic (GAR) -- established Decoration Day as a time for the nation to decorate the graves of the war dead with flowers. Maj. Gen. John A. Logan declared that Decoration Day should be observed on May 30. It is believed that date was chosen because flowers would be in bloom all over the country." (www.va.gov)

It gradually became known as Memorial Day and was declared a federal holiday and moved to the last Monday in May to organize a three-day weekend beginning in 1971. The passage of the National Holiday Act of 1971 by Congress made it an official holiday.

Those who seek to remind people of the more somber meaning of Memorial Day have advocated for Congress to change the date of the holiday back to May 30, instead of making it part of a three-day weekend of leisure.

Though those efforts have not been successful, Congress established "The National Moment of Remembrance" in 2000, asking Americans to pause for a minute of silence and reflection in honor of those who died in military service at 3 p.m. local time on Memorial Day.

For those who have lost loved ones in the military, hearing "Happy Memorial Day" can feel jarring. Many veterans have expressed their displeasure with the phrase, deeming it inappropriate for the occasion.

"I do not know a single veteran who expects the country to mark this holiday with 24 hours of uninterrupted sadness," noting that "however well intentioned, this attitude does nothing to preserve the memory of those who died defending our way of life. In fact, it does the opposite."

"This Memorial Day, take a moment and head to the ocean or a special place when the sun is coming up or sometime during the day. Spend some time alone, and think about those who never made it back," after that "Then return to your family and be grateful for your life. Fire up the grill and invite friends over. And wish each of them a Happy Memorial Day, knowing full well that this day and the joy it brings are gifts you can never repay. Except, perhaps, by living a life full of happiness as all our fallen family and friends would have wanted."

After serving in the Army and Air Force for 31.5 years and participating in several Memorial Day events and funerals, this



time of the year reminds me of why I served and makes me remember those who have given the ultimate sacrifice for our freedoms. Let's remember them together and

not take our freedoms for granted. Have a Safe and Blessed Memorial Weekend. Pay Attention to the cage drivers and look out for each other. Remember those who gave the Ultimate Sacrifice.

"The National Moment of Remembrance encourages all Americans to pause wherever they are at 3 p.m. local time on Memorial Day for a minute of silence to remember and honor


those who have died in service to the nation. As Moment of Remembrance founder Carmella LaSpada states: "It's a way we can all help put the memorial back in Memorial Day."







appy May everybody! I certainly do hope all is well with all of you wonderful readers! I'm going to change things up a little bit this month from my normal rantings. I'm going to share my and my wife's experience of a unique Concealed Pistol License (CPL) class that we took. Though I already have my CPL, I wanted to compare this class to the class I took 4 years

I had been bugging my wife, "Stabby", to get her Concealed Pistol License ever since I got mine. She was always hesitant to do so for the fact that she wasn't overly confident shooting a pistol, let alone carrying one. She had always shot rifles and smaller pistols outdoors, so after multiple trips to the gun range, she finally felt comfortable enough and decided to "pull the trigger". I told

her to pick where she wanted to go, and after some looking around and feedback from some friends of ours that went there, she decided on Applied Training Solutions (ATS) in Midland, MI.

As I couldn't summarize it any better, straight from their website (www.simu-range.com): "The Applied Training Solutions Academy is a firearms training and skills training center located in the Midland Mall. The Academy is an initiative of Applied Training Solutions, LLC and was created to deliver world-class firearms training to both civilian and law enforcement personnel. ATS-Academy provides training and firearms learning experiences that are unavailable from other instructors or training centers in the Midwest. Our team of combat experienced instructors have developed a science-based curriculum of skills building drills and lessons that are not widely available. By leveraging the ATS-Midland Digital and private Live Fire Training Range, their unique experiences can be translated into training that is delivered in an environment both safe and conducive to learning. The lessons are designed to meet the need of both novice, advanced, and professional firearms users."

Now that she had decided where the best class for her



was, there was only one problem, she wouldn't go alone. I had to go with her. If you have been to a CPL class before, you know how boring they can be. I knew I was going to be in for a long Saturday, so I was trying to think of ways to liven it up. At first, I had settled on being "that quy" and asking a thousand questions that are completely irrelevant to the class but then I thought "she might stab me".

So, I decided to not be an a**hole for once and write an article on the experience. I know those of you that actually do know me are completely shocked.

We got to ATS (located in the Midland, MI mall) and signed in. Upon arrival, I met Kevin and pulled him to the side explaining who I was and that I was there mostly for moral support for my wife, but that I would also like to write about our experience for Thunder Roads Michigan Magazine. He readily agreed. Jason was the one doing much of the instruction. Jason was very knowledgeable and, like most instructors, tried to liven up the (in my opinion) most boring class you'll ever take.

The first hour...well let's just say I don't fully remember. It explained the different types of guns and their firing systems, different types of ammunition, etc. When I wasn't daydreaming or looking around, I would find myself



mumbling what he was going to say before he said it. I would like to reiterate that is NOT a knock on Jason, it's that I already knew everything he was explaining. Jason did a much better job than the instructor I used 4 years ago.


Now comes the unique part of this class, the part I was looking forward to seeing. The Smokeless Range. Their website states "Smokeless Range is a development tool for both cognitive skills and marksmanship training." To me it looked like laser tag for adults, but with a purpose. The computer had ten different scenarios that you could run, and each one could be adjusted to varying levels of difficulty.

After establishing that everybody knew how to grip a pistol properly, it was time to "shoot". First up was Match Target. As soon as the image popped on the screen you had a shape and color that you had to find to shoot. Green circle, red square, blue hexagon, etc. This was working on identifying and finding the target. There were 14 targets in all for this stage. Then came the pop-up targets that is called the Transitional Drill. The silhouetted man would pop on the screen, and you got two shots, then it would pop up again in a different spot and again, two shots. Five targets

After some fun with the simulated live fire, it was time for the most boring, but important part, laws, civil liability, and the use of deadly force. This portion must be taught by an attorney, or someone trained in the use of deadly force per Michigan law. Again, I tried to resist the urge to play on my phone or go and have a smoke, because there isn't anything they are going to say that I don't already know. But I urge you, if you do take a CPL class, PAY ATTENTION HERE! This stuff is important. That is why you'll hear me mention it as much as I can in these articles for you all.

Now for the really fun part, range time. It was roughly a 15-minute drive to the range, and we were given a range time of 4:00pm. Since we left at around 2:45, that gave us an hour to kill. So, we stopped by Lee Bar (as the range is right around the corner) so I could have a beer (poor Stabby

was stuck with H2O) to try and ease my boredom. Don't worry, I wasn't planning on shooting anyways. This was my wife's day.

For as high-tech as this place was, the range surprised me. It was in somebody's backyard. Again, not a bad thing, just surprising. Now I understand why they told us to make sure we had boots. My wife didn't have boots, so after trying to lead her through the mud and water with minimal damage to her shoes, we reached the range. Everybody (excluding me) shot their state mandated 30 rounds of live ammunition out of a Siq Sauer P322. Nobody died or was injured, so in all it was a good time.

All in all, I felt that Applied Training Solutions (ATS) held a great class, for both beginners and experienced alike. In both simulated fire and live fire, both Jason and Kevin had first-class, hands-on training for the students. They answered any and all questions with extensive knowledge and respect. We will definitely be going back there again for some of the other simulated firing classes that they offer. It's a lot cheaper than ammunition after all. Check out their website for various class offers and scheduling. Stabby is especially looking into the Woman Shooter Wednesdays. Until next time, vote accordingly.




